Stylish start for first hair show

The curling, up-dos and crimping began at 7am yesterday and models were rehearsing throughout the day amid a cloud of hairspray at Norwich Fashion Week's new home, Open, in Bank Plain.

Deborah Dominic, show co-ordinator and owner of Hairsmiths salon, said: "The work is amazing what has been done. There are nine different salons here and all of the make-up artists are from Norwich School of Beauty. The models have been great."

Matchday honour for boy who helped after crash

His quick thinking helped a friend in his hour of need, and now he will be honoured as Norwich City's community hero at today's home match against Manchester City.

Sigurd Sorboen, known as Siggys to his friends, is being recognised for his calm and mature actions after a car hit his close friend, Joe Fisher, who is a player in the Community Sports Foundation's Player Development Centre.

They were walking to school when Joe was hit at 30mph, lifting him up in the air and breaking his pelvis, as well as knocking him unconscious. Siggys, who is 12, immediately

jumped into action, calling an ambulance for his friend before getting hold of Joe's mum, Lisa, to tell her what had happened.

After Joe regained consciousness and became visibly distressed, Siggys continued to talk to him to reassure

him that an ambulance was on the way and that he would be OK.

When the emergency services arrived, Siggys gave details of the accident and did not leave his friend's side until he was safely in the ambulance.

Joe is now out of hospital, and, according to his mum, describes Siggys as his hero.

Asked by footballer Nathan Redmond how he kept so calm, Siggys replied simply: "I just did what anyone else would have done."

The pair will bring out the matchball today at the start of the crunch tie.

Two men will be put on trial for murder

Two men will stand trial for murder later this year after the death of a man in Great Yarmouth.

Andrew McGowan, 33, died after being stabbed at a property in Dickens Court in the town on November 14 last year.

Tevin Birmingham, 21, and Warren Blake, 18, appeared at Norwich Crown Court yesterday having both been charged with murder.

Birmingham, of Spring Road, Ipswich, who appeared via videolink from HMP Norwich, and Blake, of Thorncliffe Road, London, who appeared in the dock, both entered not guilty pleas.

Both have also been charged with other offences in relation to the case, but they were not put to the two defendants.

Both men, who were remanded in custody, will stand trial for murder on May 16.

Two other people have been charged in connection with the incident.

Kevin Wood, 45, of Nelson Road Central, Yarmouth, has been charged with perverting the course of justice, but did not appear in court for the hearing.

A warrant has been issued for his arrest.

Charlene Barber, 34, of Dickens Avenue, Yarmouth, has also been charged with perverting the course of justice.

She entered a not guilty plea and will stand trial on May 16.
